

1. Educational Visit by Students in the Month of October, 2025:

- On October 17, 2025, a group of **54 first-semester students from various departments of Regent Education and Research Foundation, located in North 24 Parganas district**, visited Gandhi Smarak Sangrahalaya, Barrackpore as part of their institutional educational tour. The students were accompanied by their faculty members.



During the visit, the group was provided with a comprehensive guided tour of the museum galleries, enabling them to gain insights into the life, activities, and philosophy of Mahatma Gandhi, as well as the broader narrative of India's freedom movement. Following the gallery visit, the students attended a documentary film screening on the Indian Freedom Movement, which further enriched their understanding of the historical context and significance of the struggle for independence.

2. Educational Visits by Students in the Month of November, 2025 (10 & 13 November 2025):

During the second week of November 2025, Gandhi Smarak Sangrahalaya, Barrackpore witnessed visits by several groups of college and school students as part of their academic and co-curricular activities.

- On **November 10, 2025**, a group of **25 B.Ed. students from Madhyamgram B.Ed. College** visited the museum as part of their educational programme.



- Subsequently, on **November 13, 2025**, a group of **35 students from Nawabganj Girls' High School** visited the museum, accompanied by their teachers, as part of their co-curricular activities.



During both visits, the students were provided with guided tours across all galleries of the museum by the staff members, enabling them to gain comprehensive insights into the life, philosophy, and contributions of Mahatma Gandhi and the broader context of India's freedom movement. 3. Educational Visit by Students in the Month of December, 2025:

- On December 11, 2025, a group of 120 students of Class II from Modern English Academy School, Barrackpore and another group of 52 students of Classes VIII and IX from Joynagar Pollisree Vidyaniketan in Howrah district visited the Sangrahalaya along with their teaching staff as part of their educational excursion.





- Subsequently, on **December 18, 2025**, **45 students and 12 faculty members** from **Noapara Bhramhamoyee W.B. School** visited the museum for a similar educational programme.





- Further, on **December 23, 2025**, a large group comprising **170 students and faculty members from Panchasayar Siksha Niketan H.S., Kolkata** visited the Sangrahalaya, bringing vibrant enthusiasm and curiosity to the museum environment.

- On **March 24, 2026**, 110 students from the Department of Political Science of **Sreerampur Girls' College** visited the Sangrahalaya.



- Further, on **March 29, 2026**, a Scout group from **Ichapore Nawabganj Scout Group** visited the museum.
